In accordance with Rule 86 of the Society as amended at the AGM on 4 August 2008, the accounts and financial statements have been subject to independent examination by Mr. Westbury in accordance with the provisions of section 4A of the 1968 Friendly and Industrial and Provident Societies Act.

2. Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

3. Report of the Board for the Period

Vision

The Silkmen Supporters' Trust is committed to the improvement and development of Macclesfield Town FC by working in partnership with the Club, the fans and the community to the mutual benefit of all.

Objectives

In June 2015, the SST Board defined and agreed a new set of objectives for the Trust:

- 1. To work with the Club to improve the match-day experience for supporters
- 2. To provide a communication bridge between the fans and the Club
- 3. To be a channel for the Club to communicate with supporters
- 4. To recruit as many members to the SST as possible so as to be truly representative of the fan base
- 5. To provide benefits for our members
- 6. To identify supporters' issues, assess them and, where appropriate, try to resolve them with the Club
- 7. To encourage the raising of funds that are used for the benefit of supporters, the community and the Club
- 8. To encourage supporter led projects and initiatives and, where appropriate, provide them with financial, administrative and media support
- To seek permanent SST representation in the governance structure of the Club

The following is a report of how we have acted towards meeting those objectives during the period of 1st July to 30th June 2018.

1. To work with the Club to improve the match-day experience for supporters

Although we have committed funds to improvements to the main Club suite which will give a better experience to supporters these will not occur until the next financial year. However, our Membership Secretary has taken on the responsibility of organising one of the away coaches following the sad passing of its former organiser.

- 2. To provide a communication bridge between the fans and the Club
- 3. To be a channel for the Club to communicate with supporters

We have met with the Chairman to address concerns of some fans that staff were not being paid on time. We also were in contact with the Chairman when rumours

were circulating that the players had not been paid on time. We received a response from the Chairman explaining the situation which we then circulated to our members. We also urged the Chairman to hold a Fans' Forum to deal with the concerns of the fans surrounding the departure of the Manager.

4. To recruit as many members to the SST as possible so as to be truly representative of the fan base

Despite promotion on our website and by e-mail, membership has remained broadly unchanged which, though disappointing, is a common problem for Supporters' Trusts.

5. To provide benefits for our members

We have not had the opportunity to re-negotiate our membership benefits from previous seasons – the General Manager they were agreed with has left the Club and not been replaced.

6. To identify supporters' issues, assess them and, where appropriate, try to resolve them with the Club

Other than those issues raised at 2 and 3 we have received no further requests for intervention.

7. To encourage the raising of funds that are used for the benefit of supporters, the community and the Club

As well as membership fees, the Board raised funds through our yearly "Silk Pledge" campaign (£2,713), our Christmas Raffle (£920.64), our Easyfundraising cashback campaign (£324) and also the auction of items donated to us by our supporters (£246.50).

Other than essential running costs, all our expenditure was in accordance with this objective – payment for a new sit on mower for the groundsmen, a 50% contribution to the cost of new IT equipment for the Club Offices and new radios for the stewards, a £1000 donation to the Silkmen Campaign fund, a 50% contribution to the aeration of the pitch, provision of trophies for the Player of the Year Awards and shirt sponsorship. We also made contributions to a Thank You evening organised for Club volunteers and team building meal organised for the players.

8. To encourage supporter-led projects and initiatives and, where appropriate, provide them with financial, administrative and media support

We continue to provide considerable administrative support to the Super Silk Lotto which generates £500 for the Club every month.
