### Report of the Board for the Year

#### Vision

The Silkmen Supporters' Trust is committed to the improvement and development of Macclesfield Town FC by working in partnership with the Club, the fans and the community to the mutual benefit of all.

### **Objectives**

In January 2019 the SST Board defined and agreed a new set of objectives for the Trust which we agreed would be reviewed at the end of each season and these revised objectives are as follows:

- 1. Work with the Club to improve the matchday experience for Supporters.
- 2. Provide a channel of communication between the fans and the Club.
- 3. Increase the membership of the SST by 25%
- 4. Identify supporters' issues, assess them and where appropriate, try to resolve them with the Club and the Fans Liaison Officer who is invited to alternate meetings.
- 5. To raise funds that will be used for the benefit of supporters, the community and the Club, encouraging supporter-led projects/initiative with financial, administrative and media support as required.

The following is a report of how we have acted towards meeting those objectives during the year from 1<sup>st</sup> July to 30<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

1. To work with the Club to improve the match-day experience for supporters

The Silkmen Supporters Trust have provided funds to support insulation in the McIlroy suite in addition to a glasswasher for the suite. This funding has helped to ensure that supporters have a much more comfortable environment within the suite during the changing seasons of the year, and the glasswasher has helped to significantly improve service to customers in the bar due to more effective cleaning of glassware.

The payment for trophies for the Player of the Year awards ensured that players received due acknowledgment of the efforts for the season as did payment towards food and sponsorship towards the testimonial season for a player (DW) who has provided outstanding service to the Silkmen over many years. The payment towards a Silkmen mascot provided evidence of the commitment of the SST to its young supporters which on this occasion was for a young boy battling cancer (alongside his brothers) which we are immensely proud of supporting.

The SST has raised vigorous concerns about the treatment of many of loyal supporters in the London Road side of the ground who were effectively removed from a part of the ground (where many of them has supported the club peacefully from for many years) at both very short notice, and with little explanation. This had led to support from the SST of a peaceful march in support of protests about this action, and temporary cessation of a regular monthly contribution from the Super Silk Lotto which has provided significant funds to the football club over the years.

### 2. Provide a channel of communication between the fans and the Club

The Silkmen Supporters Trust has communicated with the chairman major shareholder and Chief Executive of Macclesfield Town Football Club in the form of face to face meetings on several occasions, emails, and a series of open letters (which have been made available on both the SST websites and unofficial fans forums) where we have raised questions about a number of issues of concern to our fanbase including:

- Lack of engagement between the Silkmen hierarchy and fans.
- Disconnect between local businesses which have previously supported the football club.
- Lack of sponsorship for games in our first year back in the Football league.
- The closure of London Road terrace which had a negative impact upon the matchday experience of many long-standing supporters in that section of the ground-
- The serious neglect in maintenance of Butch's Bar; a supporter's bar in the London Road section of the ground.
- The consistent late payment of wages to playing and non-playing staff at MTFC and the subsequent hardship for them and their families that such an action precipitated.

The Silkmen Supporters Trust continues to encourage dialogue between the Silkmen hierarchy and its loyal supporters, and is committed to providing as effective a channel of communication as it can be.

### 3. Increase the membership of the SST by 25%

Although we are delighted to have seen evidence of new membership, recruitment remains a consistent challenge and we have not reached our target of 25%. There is a commitment towards a number of initiatives including family and business memberships to increase numbers with in the SST.

4. Identify supporters' issues, assess them and where appropriate, try to resolve them with the Club and the Fans Liaison Officer who is invited to alternate meetings.

As can be seen above, the SST has proactively attempted to identify supporters' issues and raise them with the club and minutes of SST meetings consistently reflect the engagement of Fans Liaison Officer Rob Trafford during SST board meetings. I would like to place on my record my sincere gratitude to Rob for his professional pragmatic and empathic approach to this role and long may our mutually beneficial relationship continue.

5. To raise funds that will be used for the benefit of supporters, the community and the Club, encouraging supporter-led projects/initiative with financial, administrative and media support as required.

The SST is committed to financially support the club through raising funds via such funding streams as the Super Silk Lotto, Silk Pledge and Easy Fundraising, and has discussed plans for a Christmas raffle and SST led children's soccer tournament with a clear emphasis in the next financial year of improving the facility of Butch's Bar and surrounding area to maximise fan experience within London Road and Star Lane End sections of the ground.
